

The Rangeley Public Library seeks a detail-oriented, computer-literate person with good people skills for a part-time cataloging librarian position. This position averages approximately 20 hours per week including some Saturdays.

This position is responsible for accessioning of new media including creating and maintaining RDA and MARC catalog records, preparing books and other media for circulation, maintaining the collection by reviewing circulation and condition of media, weeding as necessary, monitoring overdue materials, staffing the circulation desk, assisting patrons with their information needs, and other jobs as necessary.

Minimum requirements include a high school diploma, attention to detail, computer literacy, good word processing skills, outstanding customer service skills, familiarity with popular books. We are willing to train the right candidate in cataloging.

This position pays \$12-\$15 per hour, depending on experience.
