The kids are back in school and life has settled into its predictable fall pace. But life is certainly not back to "normal". Here at the library, we have put our traditional fall children's programs on hold for now due to the ongoing pandemic. However, we have not forgotten about the kids. We have begun a collection of educational resources called STEAM Kits (short for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math). These kits have hands-on activities with accompanying educational books to teach and reinforce various lessons. To begin with, the library has purchased two coding and robotics kits, one aimed at 4 to 9 year olds, and one aimed at age 9 and up. We have also purchased a kit to help budding astronomers learn about our universe (aimed at ages 4 and up).

These kits may be checked out by an adult for up to two weeks. They are perfect for any parent or grandparent looking for educational enrichment activities to do with children. If these initial steam kits are well-received, the library hopes to add other kits to the collection on a variety of fun and educational topics. We hope these kits will help you enjoy learning together.


