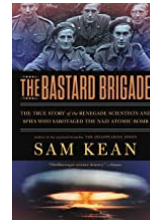
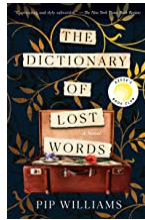

Preschool Story Hour

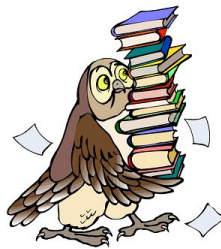
Fridays at 10:00am
