You also may have noticed a change in how you access ebooks through the Cloud Library. They have recently changed Rangeley Public Library accounts over to the new system. What this means for you is that you now need to use your new 14-digit account number as well as your pin number to get in. For most people, your pin number is the last four digits of the first phone number that we have listed in your library registration. You may go into your account at any time and change your pin to whatever number you want it to be. If you are not sure what your number is (some people have very old phone numbers listed in their accounts!) or you need help changing your password, just give us a call.

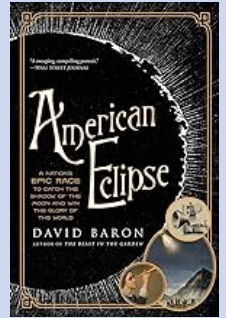
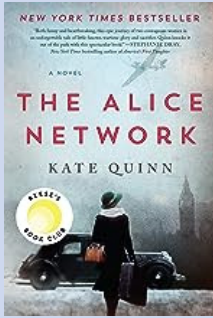
